OBJECTIVES AND INVESTMENT POLICY

The aim of the fund is to outperform its benchmark, the DJ STOXX 600 NR (dividends re-invested) over the recommended holding period.

This index reflects the investment universe of the Sub-Fund but is not compelling to its management.

This Sub-Fund complies with European standards and is actively managed on a discretionary basis. In order to achieve this objective, the Sub-Fund is constantly 75% to 110 % invested in equities from various sectors and market capitalisations, of which:

- 0% to 25% in non european equity markets (OECD countries or emerging),
- 0% to 25% in interest rate instruments of private and public sector, with a minimal acquisition rating of Afor the short-term or BBB- for the long term according to the Standard & Poor's rating system or an equivalent acquisition rating based on the analysis of the management company,
- 0% to 25% in currency risk.

The Sub-Fund will not be exposed to the convertible bonds' market. The cumulative exposure will not exceed 110% of the assets.

The Sub-Fund can invest up to 10% in shares of an UCITS.

The Sub-Fund may also invest in derivative products or products that may include some derivative element. The Manager will take open or hedging positions to cover equity risks and will be able to hedge currency risks through derivatives.

The Sub-Fund is eligible to PEA (Equity SavingsPlan) in France.

Demands for subscribing and/or redeeming units must be received by the administrator. CACEIS Bank, Luxembourg, before 16h00(4.00 PM) on any business day, when the Net Asset Value is calculated. They will be carried out based on the next Net Asset Value at unknown quote and settled on T+2.

The recommended period should be minimum 5 years.

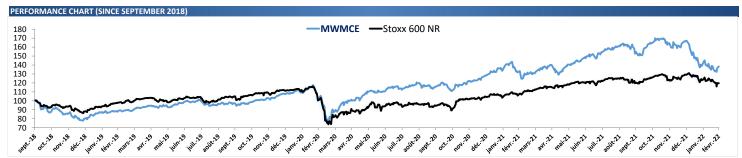
The Sub-Fund will capitalize the income derived from its investments.

COMMENTS

Since the beginning of the year, the main concern for the financial markets has been inflation, which has reached multi-decades records in January: 7.5% in US, and more than 5% in Europe. Robust demand, supported by strong labour markets, faces a supply-side impacted by persisting bottlenecks. Strongly rising energy costs are another important element. In response to this situation, after months of denial, the central banks have resolved to initiate a rate-hiking cycle. These economic considerations have been partially overshadowed by the invasion Russian invasion of Ukraine. Today, no one can foresee the outcome of this war. What is certain, though, is that the massive sanctions already imposed on Russia by western countries generate additional disruptions on the supply chains and major pressure on energy and raw material prices.

In this very tense environment, risk aversion has sharply surged. In February, stock markets came down significantly with a marked underperformance for the European markets: EuroStoxx -7%, S&P 500 -4%. On the bond markets, rates were on a rising trend until the beginning of the war. Thus, the American 10-year and the German 10-year had risen 20 bps to reach 1.8% and 0%, respectively during the last month, before the geopolitical events completely reverted this trend, bringing them back to an unchanged level (0,1% and 1,8%, respectively).

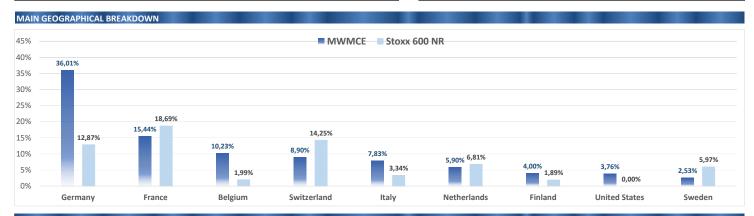
In the context of the scenario described above, the February performances of the compartment (-3.3%) and of the Stoxx 600 index (-3.2%) were almost equal. Record results and positive outlooks given by many of the companies present in the portfolio helped only little, even if their direct exposure to Ukraine and Russia is very limited. While it is more difficult to assess the indirect impact of the conflict and the imposed sanctions, it is worth highlighting that most of the portfolio companies can pass on higher input costs due to their strong market position and pricing power. Our portfolio is composed of fundamentally sound companies with strong balance sheets. Many of them benefit from robust structural growth drivers and should therefore be able to weather this crisis.

Among the compartment's holdings, Alfen (+31.9%) and Verbio (+26.3%) where the top performers in February. Both stocks benefited from strong company guidance and their exposure to the theme of renewable energies. Evotec (-25.5%), which suffered from a terminated cooperation, and PVA TePla (-20.6%) were among the compartment's weakest performers in February.

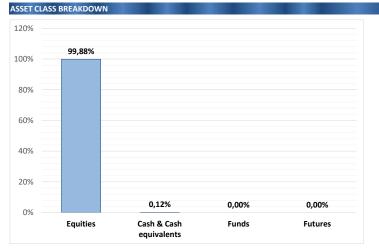
Over the month, we sold our positions in Dermapharm, Wallix and Uniper (Russia exposure) and started to invest in Digital Value and Elmos Semiconductor.

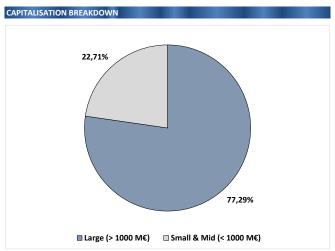
